"And He has made from ONE BLOOD every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, hand has determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings ..."

Colossians 3:11 NCV

In the new life there is no difference between Greeks and Jews, those who are circumcised and those who are not circumcised, or people who are foreigners, or Scythians. There is no difference between slaves and free people. But Christ is in all believers, and Christ is all that is important.

"Race is mostly a social theory that was devised and refined over the centuries to serve the economic and religious goals of a majority culture, first in European territory, then later in America. Whiteness, it turns out, is a very recent idea in the grand scheme of history, but it's a powerful one that was used to create categories and systems that would place value, economically and otherwise, on skin color and the groups of people who were either blessed or burdened by it. 4 Stages People Live In Concerning Other Cultures:

- 1. Segregation: total and complete separation ruled by prejudice
- 2. Toleration: recognition that other cultures have rights accompanied by a silent unwillingness to move beyond that
- 3. Integration: willingness to mix together as a sign of acceptance but an unwillingness to move off of one's cultural stand
- 4. Reconciliation: a change of the inward heart condition that adopts a KINGDOM mindset of doing life together

Characteristics of the Higher Order of Love:

1. Rises above offenses

Proverbs 18:19 NKJ

A brother offended is harder to win than a strong city, and contentions are like the bars of a castle.

Matthew 24:10-11 NKJ

"And then many will be offended, will betray one another, and will hate one another. Then many false prophets will rise up and deceive many."

Offense: SKANDALON — Greek word for the trap to catch an animal

Betray: no longer defend or guard another person

Hate: no more grace for that relationship

"Offense can distort or divide a relationship that once was obvious or ordained."

2. Lives in a perpetual state of forgiveness.

Acts 24:16 NKJ

This being so, I myself always strive to have a conscience without offense toward God and men.

Hebrews 12:14-15 NKJ

Pursue peace with all people, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord: looking carefully lest anyone fall short of the grace of God; lest any ROOT OF BITTERNESS springing up cause trouble, and by this many become defiled ...

3. Your love for God is measured by the person you love the least.

1 John 4:20-21 NIV

Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves god must also love their brother and sister.

Romans 12:17-21 NIV
